Vision Statement

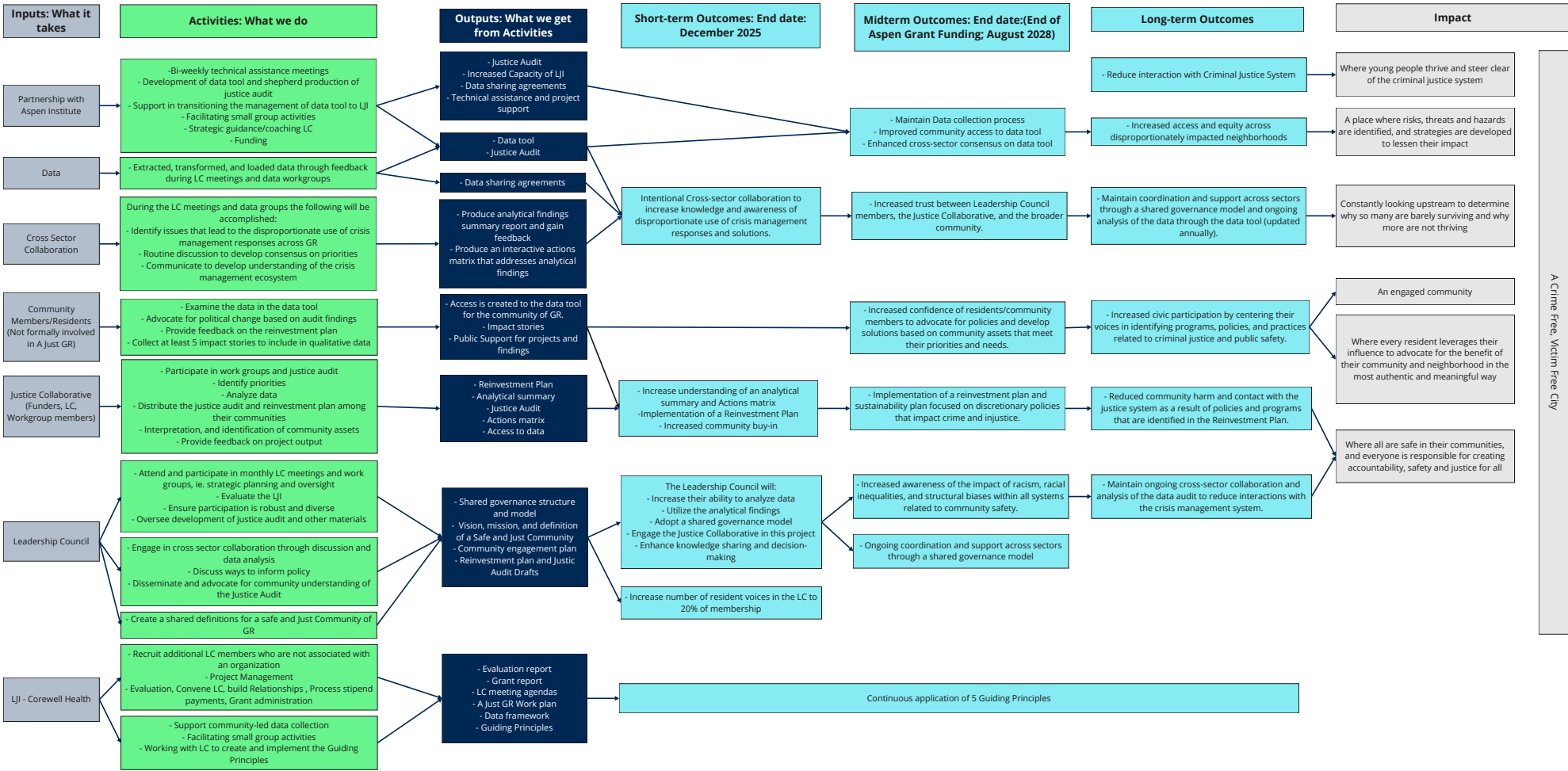
We will work towards eliminating disparities and achieve equity through data sharing and systems collaboration to secure public safety, health and well-being, and belonging. These actions will help to improve the quality of life for our city's residents and neighborhoods and create a more just GR.

Situational Analysis: Acknowledging History and Root Cause

Landscape scan: Current crisis management responses are a result of racist government interventions at the federal and local levels in addition to their local application. Solutions to these interventions are often short-term with time-limited funding. Additionally, the solutions have tended to lack the inclusion of input from the public.

- Lack of collaboration between sectors and community, including relationships, resources, and data.
 - Black Residents and Residents of Color who have been historically marginalized.
 - Residents with frequent interactions with crisis management services.
 - Neighborhoods with disproportionate SDOH outcomes.
- Government interventions that disproportionately impact historically marginalized groups.

- The Stakeholders are connected to this program by some combination of directly working for a crisis management service and/or working with/supporting people who have experienced interactions with crisis management services and/or have personal experience with crisis management services.
- The outcomes most important to the group are seeing healthy neighborhoods across GR, fewer instances where residents engage crisis management services due to coordination and investment in services, and resources that prevent the need for crisis management services in the first place.
- They will engage with the evaluation process via surveys and interviews and recruiting partners to join the Justice Collaborative.
